

Since 2019, the Hunger

Relief Program increased services by nearly 400% to address community needs. Last year we:

- Distributed 901,379 lbs. of food
- Facilitated 24,870 visits to the food shelf
- Expanded numbers and locations for food distribution
- Extended food access hours to better serve the community
